

NEW SPEEDO DESIGN FOR COBRAS



Motorists urged to go nitro.

High-performance Formula One racing cars have been using it for years and large passenger aircraft won't take off or land without it.

Now Australian motorists are being told to convert.

Scott Cooper wants Australian motorists to let the air out of their tyres, and replace it with pure nitrogen.

"The tyre handles better, it runs cooler and if you're looking at a normal set of radials on a family sedan, you'll save between \$300 and \$500 per year, just on tyres alone, and that's a lot of money," he said.

"Nitrogen is a cool dry air, non-corrosive, non-combustible, environmentally friendly and it's been used throughout the world with success."

Mr Cooper runs a mobile filling station and claims nitrogen filled tyres don't deflate as much as tyres with compressed air, resulting in less wear and tear.

He says that'll increase tyre life by a whopping 30 per cent, giving you thousands of kilometres of additional wear.

"Once the Nitrogen's there, you set and forget, and you never need to check the tyres again," he said.

"It's great, then, for most of us because we do forget."

He also claims you'll save on fuel costs: as much as five percent with no tyre drag, and your car's engine won't work as hard.

"To most women it is a big issue, having to stop at a servo not knowing the exact amount to put in the tyres, getting hands dirty," she said.

For Jane Taylor, it's not only a matter of convenience; she says her car's now floating on air, since she pumped her tyres with nitrogen.

"Well it handles a whole lot better than it did," she said.

"Initially I was surprised as I didn't realise it would handle so well."

Then there's the safety issue.

Overseas evidence suggests a dramatic decrease in tyre blowouts because, unlike air, nitrogen is non-combustible.

"The safety factor is a huge one," Scott said.


"The aircraft industry aren't silly - they brought down the blow-out rate from 76 per cent to nothing overnight."

Another claim is that tyres without air don't contain moisture, which can damage not only the rubber, but also the wheel rims.

"When you take oxygen out of the air, you're left with pure Nitrogen that's a cool dry gas, environmentally friendly, not corrosive and non evasive," he said.

"I think for only \$10 to \$15 per tyre you can't lose."








"Join the Cobra Car Club of Western Australia."

BANNISTER RUN. Saturday August 9th.



After much cheerful banter the procession hit the road again for a run over the winding roads through Boddington and on to Dwellingup then via Del Park Road out to South West Highway.




the journey.

NITRO TYRES.....cont:

Peter Hough has found the ride in his supercharged Commodorè a lot smoother since he switched over.

"It makes a big difference in handling," he said.

"A lot softer ride also seems to stick to the road a lot better; cornering there's a big difference, not as much strain on the car."

While there appear to be benefits in running on nitrogen, motoring experts say there are other ways of increasing tyre life and getting better fuel economy.

It's as easy as following a few simple tips.

Russell Manning from the Royal Automobile Cub of Queensland, says more than 80 per cent of drivers don't check their tyres regularly, and that costs them money.

"Things like keeping tyre pressure right, normal maintenance, rotation of tyres, wheel alignment and wheel balance," he said.

"If you do that, you will get much-improved fuel consumption and tyre life."

"Typically, tyres that are low in pressure add drag, so you use more fuel to overcome the drag."


"If you pump up your tyres, you can get four-to-five per cent improvement in fuel consumption, by doing that alone."

However if, like most of us, checking your tyre pressure is a chore, then nitrogen might be the way the go.
